"New Builder" in the title may be misleading. Grandfathered credential holders may use these classes to earn continuing education credits to renew their qualifier credential.

Dept. of Commerce ID #8931 -- 12.0 Continuing Education Credits for RENEWING the Dwelling Contractor Qualifier Credential OR 12.0 Qualifier Credits for APPLYING FOR the Dwelling Contractor Qualifier Credential



Beginning January 1, 2008 contractors and remodelers need a new credential in order to pull building permits in Wisconsin—the Dwelling Contractor Qualifier Certification (DCQC).

Between November 2008 and May 2009, the Wisconsin Builders Association® (WBA) will present six "New Builder Education" classes that offer 12 credits. **These credits can be used as Initial Training to earn the Dwelling Contractor Qualifier Credential or as continuing education credits to renew the DCQC.**

WBA's "New Builder Education" class has three separate, but integrated four-hour segments. The first and third phases cover construction laws and business practices; the second phase covers building codes and construction practices. Up to four instructors present the material for the 1-1/2 day workshop.

Attorneys from Axley Brynelson LLP speak from experience on contracts, warranties, liens, the recently enacted Right to Cure law, and more. They also describe the difference between an independent contractor and an employee—a gray area that's interpreted differently by several agencies. For reasons of Worker's Compensation, Unemployment Compensation, liability and more, contractors need to know the difference.

Instructor Devin Rains is the energetic and engaging presenter for the codes and construction practices segment. Among other credentials, he is an instructor in the Architectural Technician Program and Construction and Remodeling Program at Madison Area Technical College. He is also a certified UDC construction and HVAC inspector. As code consultant to the Wisconsin Builders Association®, Rains has taught, reviewed and presented code throughout Wisconsin.

Each phase concludes with an objective test. To be eligible to apply for the Dwelling Contractor Qualifier Credential, participants must achieve an average grade of 70 percent on the three segments.
